FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING

Christ conquers! Christ rules! Christ reigns!

Today is the last Sunday of this liturgical year and it ends with the feast of Christ the King. This feast was introduced by the Pope Pius the XI in 1925 and in 1969 this feast was placed on the last Sunday of Ordinary Time, where its theme of Christ's dominion made it a fitting end to the liturgical year.

The Kingdom of God is the central teaching of Jesus throughout the Gospels. The word 'kingdom' appears more than any other word throughout the four Gospels. Jesus begins His public ministry by preaching the kingdom. "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent, and believe in the gospel".

Today's liturgy presents Jesus as the King. Jesus Christ is a real king because of **what he did**. What Jesus proclaims by word, he enacts in his ministry. He gave us everything he had when he died on the cross so that all generation may be saved by his blood. His love is selfless, sacrificial, kind, compassionate, forgiving and unconditional.

Jesus is a **unique king with a unique kingdom**; There is none other like him in the history of the world. A king without a kingdom; without a throne; without a guard; without self-defense and without support from anyone. Jesus Christ still lives as king, in thousands of human hearts. The human hearts are his kingdom, the cross is his throne, colt is his carriage, angels are his guardians, and the Sermon on the Mount is his rule of law.

On this great feast day, let us surrender our lives to the rule of Christ and resolve to give Christ the central place in our lives and conclude the Church year: by proclaiming

Year of Prayer and Reflection on the Lord's Prayer

And forgive us our trespasses...

"Abba, our Father... forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us," echoes the Sacrament of Reconciliation and also brings to mind the fifth day of Creation, when God transformed the waters of chaos into fountains of life. This prefigures an even greater transformation - Christ's eternal sacrifice that transforms the cosmic waters of death, brought forth by our Fall, into springs of eternal life. Christ purchased on our behalf the very forgiveness we ask for in the Lord's Prayer. Not in the sense of appeasing a tyrant God, but rather in terms of infinite redress for the infinite separation or "sundering" (sin) brought about by the Fall. This forgiveness isn't freely given because it's cheaply bought - it's freely given because it's been infinitely purchased through Christ's perfect sacrifice, eternally present. In Sacramental Reconciliation, we receive the grace (drawing closer to God) of that forgiveness.

Just as the waters of Creation suddenly teemed with life at God's command, the waters of our sin, when touched by Christ's sacrificial love, burst forth with the abundance of grace. Through the Eucharist, we participate in this cosmic restoration. Here, the fruits of Christ's sacrifice - forgiveness and life - become our daily bread. And through Reconciliation, we enter into this movement from death to life, letting grace multiply where sin once reigned. When we extend forgiveness to others, we're not merely making a choice to be a nice person - we're participating in Christ's cosmic rebalancing of all reality. We're letting the life-giving waters of His grace teem and multiply, lifting us and others from the death of separation toward the fullness of divine life.

This divine pattern echoes through Salvation History: Noah's dove, released over the waters of the flood, returns with an olive branch - a sign of new life and God's forgiveness. The early Christians recognized this profound connection between water, life, and salvation when they chose the fish - ICHTHYS - as their secret symbol. This simple drawing contained their entire confession of faith: lesous CHristos, THeou Yios, Soter (Jesus Christ, Son of God, Savior) - the One whose sacrifice transforms the waters of death into abundant life. - Dr Bryn Sparks




PRAYER FOR WORLD PEACE
