LET US CELEBRATE WHAT IS BEST IN OURSELVES

'Fixing his eyes' on us, Jesus invites us to celebrate with him *what is best in ourselves*. What is the best in ourselves? It is love.

We are born to love. Every creature in this world longs for love. Love is the most powerful force in the world, in dealing with individuals as well as in building communities.

Today's Gospel challenges us to do precisely the opposite of what our human nature wants us to do - the principle of "an eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth". We must meditate today's Gospel text as Jesus wants us to: not as a burdensome obligation, but as a celebration of love and compassion.

The words of Jesus cut to the heart of the matter: Love your enemies; Bless those who curse you; Pray for those who mistreat you; Give to everyone who asks; Do good for your enemies, lend them money expecting nothing back; be merciful, just as your Father is merciful; Stop judging, Stop condemning, Forgive and you will be forgiven. Do to others as you would have them do to you.

We are given an example of this in our first reading, with David and Saul. Who were David and Saul? Saul was King. But who were they to each other? Saul was David's father-in-law, and he was hunting down his son-in-law to kill him. Saul saw David as a threat. Saul was jealous of David. However, David had the best opportunity to strike his enemy-Saul but never did. What a devout man! David exemplifies the teaching of our Lord in the Gospel today.

To be a Christian means celebrating love always and everywhere and creating a culture of love. It is how we evangelize; it is how we turn an unbeliever into a believer; it is how we turn a sinner into a saint.

DAY OF FASTING AND ABSTINENCE FROM MEAT

Anyone over the age of 18, but under the age of 59, should eat only one full meal on those days. Although they can also have small amounts of food in the morning and the evening.



THIS FINANCIAL YEAR 2024-2025 is coming to an end. It is time to print new envelopes for the Planned Giving.
